

## BLUEPRINT PIKE PLACE MARKETFRONT

Construction on the MarketFront extension of Pike Place Market kicked off this past May—an addition that will convert a 30,000-square-foot parking lot on Western Avenue into a vibrant public plaza with amazing views of Puget Sound and the Olympic Mountains. It is the first piece of the greater central waterfront development to move forward. The design, spearheaded by The Miller Hull Partnership, calls for 12,000 square feet of commercial space, including ample room for farmers, craftspeople and artisans to display their wares. The MarketFront caps off the Market Historic District and brings the 40-year-old vision to fruition, connecting the main arcade via the Desimone Bridge and featuring multiple public art installations throughout. The \$73 million project, funded by the Pike Place Market Preservation and Development Authority, is scheduled for completion in late 2016. **pikeplacemarket.org**
